## WHAT IS IT?

*The Dollars and Sense of Saving Special Places* is a lively, hour-long illustrated presentation that examines the effects of growth, the benefits of open space, the economics of land use, and funding sources available to support conservation projects. A 10-30 minute discussion period typically follows the show. A shorter presentation with fewer elements of the show can also be arranged.

The information is specific to New Hampshire and is customized for each community where it is given. With advance notice, presenters may be able to incorporate specific local issues into the presentation.
